We recently delivered 80 pounds of cereal and other nonperishable food items to the Salvation Army. Our thanks to all who helped make this possible. On June 12th, representatives from Outreach once again prepared lunch for the residents of the Hope House Women's and Children's Center.

We continue to collect used medicine bottles which are donated to the senior center and forwarded to third world countries.

We also collect used ink cartridges and receive rewards from Staples which help offset some of our office expenses. In order to participate in this program, we must purchase a minimum of \$30 in ink every six months.
