


Esther/Rebekah Circle did not meet this month. They hope to resume meeting in the fall at the church.

LOVE GIFT

We have been blessed with the calling of Pastor Jeff to our congregation. Prior to the Corona virus, we had a renewing of wonderful youth activities. Second hour was growing, scouting activities returned to the church and a new involvement with the Middletown Youth Coalition. Associate Pastor Jeff Wilder is actively engaged in the commissioning process that **Pastor Connor recently** completed. This will allow Pastor Jeff to have the credentials within the Ohio Region of the Disciples of Christ church for standing as a Reverend in our denomination. Along with the educational requirement, Pastor Jeff will have to complete a psychiatric profile and evaluation. This process costs around \$1,100 plus some travel time for meetings. Our Garden is beginning to take shape. We are quite late with everything due to the unseasonably cold and WET spring. (We pray that there is not an early fall to reduce our harvest.) However, corn has sprouted. Radishes are coming up. Squashes - zucchini & yellow -- are looking good. Green peppers are healthy. Due to our cucumbers not all surviving transplanting, we just put in 16 hills of cucumbers alongside the few plants that we have. Bush green beans are looking good. We have just put in a second, late planting of corn. Dave & Larry's Three sisters plot is taking shape -- Corn and acorn squash have sprouted. As soon as the corn gets a bit bigger, we will put in the pole beans at the base. Dave, Aidan McMonigle, & Larry did some weeding this past week and, believe it, or not, we actually had to water as the garden area had become quite dry. With summer upon us, we're going to need volunteers for weeding and watering. Please contact Larry or Dave to sign up. Also, even if you're not attending worship services, do drive by and take a look at everything that is growing in this small plot.
