

"FEED MY SHEEP" GARDEN UPDATE

Connor **Pastor** conducted dedication of our 'Feed My Sheep' garden project on Sunday, 19 July 2020. Most, who were in attendance for worship walked out for this service. All were quite surprised at iust everything is. Everything is quite BIG and we are experiencing very good yields. As of 27 July 2020, we have had 137 radishes of varying kinds, 69 yellow squash totaling 69#, 83 zucchinis totaling 142#, 114 cucumbers totaling 38#, 23 green peppers totaling 5.5#. Not counting the radishes, that's 330.5## of produce thus far in July. The green beans will be picked soon. Likewise, assuming the winds does not blow it down, the first planting of corn should yield some sweet corn very soon. Most of our product has been donated to the Salvation Army here in Middletown for their Free Food Store. We were able to give a small amount of cucumbers, zucchinis, and yellow squash and green peppers to the food pantry at the Monroe Nazarene church just this week, as well. As we initially intended, all yields from our garden have been given away.

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JEFF

First Christian Church worships the God who never changes, his inspired word has not been changed or altered and is 2000 years old. That's some serious long-term consistency. But the way that permanent message is delivered always changes.
