ELDER MOMENT

As we are in our Lenten journey, many thoughts surface about this season and its history. Lent begins 40 days prior to Easter and excludes Sundays. So why does Easter change dates each year? Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday following the full moon that occurs on or just after the spring equinox (when the Sun shines directly on the equator and the length of day and night are nearly the same). This year Easter Sunday will be on April 4th. From an article written by Mary Fairchild, we read, "Lent is the Christian season of spiritual preparation before Easter. In Western churches, it begins on Ash Wednesday. During Lent, many Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial, and spiritual discipline. The purpose of the Lenten season is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ—to consider his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial, and resurrection." During Lent, Christians have chosen to fast or give something up. More recently, many have devoted more time in prayer and reading scripture. Whatever method we choose, we strengthen our devotion to God and that relationship is just another way of God showing his love for us. Blessings,

A MESSSAGE FROM WEEK OF COMPASSION:

Stay, Pray, Give: How to Help in Texas and Beyond



A significant winter storm brought historic low temperatures to much of the U.S. and Canada this week. The impact was especially consequential in Texas, where the infrastructure is not equipped for severe cold. Many across the state have experienced prolonged power outages as dangerously cold temperatures persist, as well as water system failures and damage due to frozen pipes.



Week of Compassion is in touch with church leaders in the affected areas, responding to needs through Disciples Regions and local congregations, as well as ecumenical partners.

So far, Week of Compassion has received reports of the following impact to Disciples. Though most of the impact is in Texas, these numbers represent multiple regions across the U.S.:

- 22 churches/camps with damage (ranging from minor leaks to inches of water throughout whole buildings)
- 19 churches with households with confirmed damage
- 14 churches/camps provided/providing relief to neighbors

Across a total of 36 congregations and 2 camps/conference centers

In addition to providing support for congregations and households that sustained damage--primarily from burst pipes and flooding--Week of Compassion is providing ministry grants for Disciples congregations as they serve their neighbors. Our churches across multiple regions are working to provide warming shelters, food assistance, and essential supplies to those in urgent need.

As always, in times of need, Disciples want to help. For now, the best way to show your love and support for those impacted by these winter storms is to "Stay, Pray and Give." CAMP CHRISTIAN SUMMER 2021!

Dear Ohio Region,

Thank you so much for your patience as we have worked on the plans and details surrounding Camp Christian this summer. We sent an update at the end of 2020, asking you to plan on having Camp and we have been hard at work to make sure that we can safely have our summer programming this year! It has taken a lot of work and conversations with the Union County Health Department, Christian Church in Ohio staff, volunteer directors for the various weeks, and a whole lot of prayer!

To be clear – if the situation changes, or if the Union County Health Department recommends we do not have Camp, we will not have Camp this summer. The only reason why we are planning to have camp is because we believe we can do so safely. Safely having camp will mean a lot of changes to our normal schedule and programming. It will certainly feel and look different this year more than any other year. But we still look forward to being able to gather together again safely at Camp Christian for our summer programming!

Attached, please find at the link below, our Policies and Procedures for Camp Christian 2021. Included in this working document will be a schedule for the summer, an outline of our policies and procedures, and a plan for our RSVPs, which will be required for this year due to the advanced planning we will need to do.

Please understand that this is a working document based on the most recent conversations we've had with the Union County Health Department, our staff, and directors. As we have updated information and recommendations, we will update our policies accordingly. We cannot anticipate what will happen or what developments may occur between now and July, but with the existing plans in place, we believe that we will be able to safely have Camp this summer. Additionally, we know that many of these may apply to one camp/conference, but not another. More specific program changes are being developed by the staff and directors and will be made available as the dates of camp get closer.

Please ask questions! Undoubtedly, many concerned parents and pastors will want to know more than what is laid out in this document. That is okay! If you have additional questions or would like follow up conversations about these policies, please reach out to our Regional Program Director, Rev. Alan Dicken at adicken@ccinoh.org.

IMPORTANT NOTE: We are needing additional counselors who can serve for Junior Camp this year. Without at least 20 additional volunteers, we won't be able to offer Junior Camp, which would be very unfortunate for the youth and for our programming.
