This month has been so exciting for First Christian and myself. There has been an amazing opportunity open up for us to spread love all over the city. One of the biggest things has been that the public schools have invited us to speak, build relationships and spread love to the students and teachers alike! This month I was invited to be a guest speaker at the Highview center. We had an assembly with all the students and spoke about bullying, unity, kindness and inclusion for all. The remarkable God moment is when all of the speakers shared the same message and points, but from a different perspective. The kids were very engaged and then went back to their class and continued the discussions in peer groups! The teachers reported they could not stop sharing what each gathered and loved about the messages! The next day myself, Pastor Connor and several pastors in town traveled to every school in the city and delivered thank you gifts to every teacher in the system! We were allowed to walk into class and "borrow" each teacher for a moment and look them in their eyes and tell them they were valued, seen, loved and appreciated. The students would clap and several teachers would just hug and cry with tears of joy that their work had been noticed. God opening doors to be able to spread light and love where the enemy tried to shut down and destroy! God is Good! Doors opening back up in our public schools to the faith community that is Only God! These things have sparked discussion on the faith community being more active in our schools. First step is

Join Pastor Connor for an Advent Study


"The Heart That Grew Three Sizes" by Matt Rawle.

Congregations around the world host CWS Blanket offerings to live out a mission to serve God's people near and far; and that's exactly how two congregations in Washington State became connected.

First Presbyterian Church of Everett has been hosting "Dinner at the Bell" for 18 years. This weekly event is for low-income families, veterans, homeless, people with addictions – any community members in need - all are welcome. Along with a hot meal, guests receive blankets and hygiene kits. "A lot of places push homeless people away, and it is nice for churches to open their arms to help people," said Amanda, a guest at "Dinner at the Bell."

In the same city, only five miles away,
Cascade View Presbyterian Church
fundraises for the blanket ministry of CWS
so that organizations and churches like
First Presbyterian can serve those in need.
"We have a church that believes strongly in
how God calls us to love and reach out,"
says Pastor Luke Hyder of Cascade View
Presbyterian. "We as a church want to
make tangible differences for those in
need."

One church gives money so the other can give blankets, and together they give hope and a tangible reminder of God's love. Hope is powerful, especially in times like these. Will you answer the call to serve God's people and give hope today?

2020 was challenging, but congregations stepped up and provided 101,472 CWS Blankets and Kits to families impacted by the pandemic, hurricanes, tornadoes, flooding and other crises including homelessness and poverty.

I want to commend Associate Pastor Jeff and his team of volunteers who have been going "out and handed blessing bags and was able to speak, pray, and love on 21 homeless individuals." This is just a short list of ALL that goes on at FCC. Well Done Team!

I would like to repeat Pastor Connor's statement in his board report "I can feel the momentum building for First Christian Church, our vision is growing, and our community impact is growing as well." No Finer words have been written to describe what we do and who we are at First Christian Church Middletown. We truly are doing God's work. Thankyou one an all.

# A Moment for History FCC Ministers/Pastors, Associates & Interims

Through the years the Middletown Church of Christ/First Christian Church (FCC) has had 10 ministers/pastors, at least 6 associates and 7 interim ministers. While there is not much detail on many of the early clergy, I will at least mention their names and their dates of service. If you are interested in historic photos of the church, take a walk down the northwest corridor of the church. There you'll find many photos, including those mentioned in this article.

As mentioned in previous article our first minister was Rev. C. C. Cowgill who was called from Washington, D.C. and began his ministry on August 1, 1913. He was accompanied by his wife and two daughters. Cowgill served until 1916 when illness prevented him from carrying out his duties.

At that time Rev. W.H. Thompson, from Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, succeeded Cowgill. Thompson served the church until 1942 when he suddenly became seriously ill. He died on Nov. 17. The pulpit was filled by interim pastor Rev. Robert Lilly until 1943.

June 6, 1943 brought Rev. Dale Brock to the pulpit. Rev. Brock's wife and four daughters accompanied him to Middletown. Rev. Brock was a graduate of Bethany College and pastor of the Church of Christ in Brilliant, Ohio. Rev. Brock preached his last sermon on March 25, 1951. He resigned to become the minister at the Christian church in Youngstown, Ohio.

On May 6, 1951 Rev. Edwin Bobbitt delivered his first sermon to this congregation. Rev. Bobbitt graduated from Transylvania University in Lexington, KY and the College of the Bible (now the Lexington Theological Seminary). Rev. Bobbitt officially retired on Dec.31, 1974, ending more than 24 years of service as our pastor.

He agreed to stay on as interim minister until March 30, 1975. During his pastorate FCC hired Rev. C. Thomas Steiner as associate Pastor in Feb. 1971 and resigned in Dec. 1974.

After Rev. Bobbitt's departure, Dr. Monroe Schuster served as interim pastor until Rev. Paul Remick was called Aug. 1, 1975. Accompanying him were his wife and two sons. Rev. Remick left FCC in Oct. 1978. Rev. Dale Humbert served as interim minister until April 9, 1979.

On April 15, 1979 Rev. Donald L. Steffy became our 6<sup>th</sup> minister. He was a graduate of Mount Union College in Columbus, Ohio and the Lexington Theological Seminary. He served churches in Kentucky & Ohio. Rev. Steffy served on the Middletown Ministerial Assoc., Pastoral Counseling Service and other organizations in the area. Rev. Steffy retired in 1994. During his service he had three associate ministers on different occasions. They were Rev. Janice Mahle, Rev. Kay Peacock and Rev. Carol Oetzel.

Rev. Dixie French served as interim Minister until Rev. Michael Weber was installed in November 1995. Weber was joined by his wife and two sons. Rev. Weber served as Sr. Minister until Oct. 1998 at which time Assoc. Minister, Carol Oetzel, served as interim minister.

October, 2000 Rev. Terry Van Heyningen, accompanied by his wife, became our Sr. Minister. Rev. Van Heyningen retired in mid-2005. Rev. Robert Harris served as interim until early 2006 when Rev. Laureen Roe became our minister.

Joining Rev. Roe were her husband and two sons. Rev. Roe formerly served as Associate Minister at the First Christian Church in Wilmington, Oh. Her focus was on the needs of today's family. Rev. Roe resigned in 2017 to become Minister of a church in Germantown, Oh. Rev. Nick Donges assumed the interim position until Rev. Tracy Siegman responded to our call.

Rev. Siegman's calling was to minister to the under privileged of our community. Much of her time with FCC was working with the Outreach committee. Residing in the inner city, Rev. Siegman was very visible in the downtown area talking with and ministering to the underprivileged in the inner city. Rev. Siegman was with us for only one year. She answered the call of another church in Covington, KY.

Once again FCC formed a search committee to select a new minister. It was decided not to hire an interim minister, but rather have guest speakers to fill the pulpit each week. Most of the speakers were ordained ministers, some of whom were retired. We were also blessed to have some of our own members present the message to the congregation. This practice was used for approximately one year. The search committee decided to approach one of the guest speakers who was an ordained minister who was not serving a church at the time. He made a favorable impression on many of our congregants. The search committee submitted the recommendation to the General Board who agreed and the congregation voted and approved and Dr. Rev. Willie Barns-Jackson was hired.

Around that same time our own Connor Thompson, who was studying for the ministry, was hired as Associate Minister. Shortly after Pastor Connor was hired Pastor Jeff Wilder, also studying for the ministry was hired as Associate Pastor. After a few months of service, it became apparent Pastor Barnes-Jackson was not a good fit for FCC. The Rev. Dr. Barnes-Jackson resigned.

Associate Pastor Connor was named interim Pastor and shortly after was named Sr. Pastor. Pastor Jeff remains as Associate Pastor. Both Pastors are continuing their educations. Not only do they minister to this congregation both are very active in the community by serving on committees and in organizations to better serve the youth and homeless in our city. Both of these men are making FCC well known in this city and around the general area as well. Other churches are seeing what we do and want to be more like us.

## "Timothies" of First Christian Church (DOC) of Middletown, Ohio

People who were reared in this congregation or sponsored by FCC who, like Timothy, the Apostle Paul's protégé who want to learn to minister to people and spread the word of Jesus Christ are recognized as Timothies by our congregation. We have sixteen people we recognize as those who have studied for the ministry.
