We are in the process of organizing a collection of items which will be given to Matthew 25 Ministries for the Ukrainian refugees. Some items will also be given to friends of Crystal who will be traveling to Poland to help with the refugee situation. The following is a list of items that are needed:

New and gently used clothing, Personal care supplies (toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, antibacterial soap, etc.) First aid supplies (band aids, gauze, bandages, antiseptic cream, etc.) Feminine hygiene items Paper products (toilet paper, paper towels) Linens, blankets, sheets Baby supplies (blankets, diapers, wipes, etc.)

New stuffed teddy bears (12 inches high or smaller)

This is a good time to do some spring cleaning and donate some good used clothing and linens to this cause. We may also make up some health kits (hand towel, washcloth, large tooth comb, nail clippers, soap, 10 band aids, and toothbrush) for this project. We will have some large boxes in the narthex or Fellowship Hall to collect these items.

I would like to thank all for investing their time. I also partnered with Melissa Guthrie who is the Executive Director of the Disciples LGBTQ+ Alliance and has helped many congregations with this process. The Disciples LGBTQ+ Alliance are members of the Christian Church (DOC) called to join in God's work of transforming the Christian Church (DOC) into a just and inclusive church that welcomes persons of all gender expressions and sexual Identities into the full life and leadership of the church. By displaying their logo publically we will be identified and listed as an open & affirming congregation. Along with the membership comes expected attributes, most of which are already in practice. A ministry is **OPEN** when it commits to communicating its welcome publicly as we do in our Mission statement. A ministry is AFFIRMING when it commits to preaching and teaching a gospel which understands that God does not reject or condemn people solely for their gender expression or sexual orientation. Information was presented to the Elders at their March meeting as well as the General Board. Both groups are in favor of presenting the motion for a congregational vote on April 3rd along with two other items.
