

A Moment for History Sunrise Services

As with all Christian churches, Easter is one, if not, the most celebrated seasons of the liturgical calendar. For many years, it has been our tradition to have a sunrise service. Prior to moving to our current location, those early morning services were held indoors. On First Avenue, the only lawn was the hill in the front of the building and the only level location was the parking lot, so the sanctuary is where it would be.

In 1990 the church purchased the property on Rosedale Rd. for a new building. The land was mostly wooded with the exception of a portion at the south end of the lot (where the garden is). It was decided to mow that part of the lot so a sunrise service could be held outdoors and actually see the sun rise on Easter morning. On the first Easter after that purchase, we had that outdoor sunrise service. I remember that morning. It was cold and foggy but a group of 35-40 hearty folks, bringing their lawn chairs, gathered on that grassy spot and were led in worship by Rev. Donald Steffy. As we worshiped, the fog began to lift and the sun began to rise. As we prepared for communion, a flock of geese flew overhead. We took the geese as a good omen and God's blessing of the site.

The most recent sunrise service was only a couple of weeks ago. This year the temperatures were probably colder than 30 years ago so Pastor Connor decided the service would take place in the sanctuary. Attendance was smaller than that first year, but a few people were in attendance, including a guest from neighborhood, who wanted to come to our church for Easter. I hope she will return. Pastors Connor & Jeff conducted the service. We sang hymns accompanied by prerecorded music. Pastor Connor told the story of Christ's resurrection and we celebrated with communion. It was a beautiful morning. Following the service an Easter breakfast was served and many of those who were attending the later service joined the early birds. Thank you to all those who prepared the meal.
